FIREARMS	The College District prohibits the use, possession, or display of a firearm on College District property or at a College District-sponsored or -related activity in violation of law, the provisions of this policy, and College District regulations.
	Licensed peace officers are authorized by law to carry firearms at all times.
OPEN CARRY	The open carrying of handguns on College District property is pro- hibited.
CARRYING CONCEALED HANDGUNS ON CAMPUS	A license holder may carry a concealed handgun, on or about the license holder's person, on College District property or in a College District vehicle, unless prohibited by state or federal law, college policy, or procedure.
	A license holder is responsible for complying with the applicable federal and state law prohibitions.
	A license holder shall secure his or her handgun at all times when it is not on or about their person.
RESIDENTIAL FACILITIES	An individual living in College District owned or leased and oper- ated dormitories or other residential facilities who is a license holder and wants to store a handgun in his or her room shall ac- quire and securely store it in an approved storage device.
SINGLE OCCUPANCY OFFICES	Concealed carry is permitted in in single occupancy offices. An employee may submit a written request for exemption in accord- ance with administrative regulations established by the District President/CEO.
	An employee who is a license holder may store a handgun in his or her office so long as the handgun is secured in a locked compart- ment in accordance with administrative regulations.
LABORATORIES AND OTHER HAZARDOUS AREAS	A license holder may not carry a concealed handgun on the sec- ond floor of the Health Sciences Center due to the presence of hands-on labs, which require physical contact, as well as magnetic resonance imaging (MRI) and X-ray machines, which pose a signif- icant safety risk with the presence of firearms.
AREAS WHERE MINOR CHILDREN ARE PRESENT	This section applies to specific areas of Blinn College campuses where minor children may be present.
	Dual Credit Classrooms – A license holder may carry a concealed handgun in classrooms where dual credit classes are taught on a Blinn College campus. Dual credit classes on high school cam- puses will adhere to the rules set forth at that specific location.

	Child Care Facilities – Blinn College does not own or operate any facility designated solely for this purpose.
	The Star of the Republic Museum and the Dr. W.W. O'Donnell Per- forming Arts Center - A license holder may carry a concealed hand- gun in the Star of the Republic Museum and the Dr. W.W. O'Don- nell Performing Arts Center.
UIL SPONSORED AND SPORTING EVENTS	Texas Penal Code subsection 46.035 (b)(2) prohibits concealed carry at any collegiate sporting event or UIL-sponsored event. Appropriate signage to that effect must be in place in accordance with Texas Penal Code 30.06. Guidelines for posting approved signage must be established and reflected in a Blinn College Administrative Procedure.
	Permanent signage shall be installed at the Kruse Center, Physical Education Building, and Leroy Dreyer Baseball Field indicating that when sporting events take place concealed carry is banned. The signs will use the standard Penal Code Sec. 30.06 language, but will also include the statement "During any sporting or UIL-spon- sored event," to clearly indicate when the ban is in place. Tempo- rary signage will be posted in areas such as Hohlt Park where Blinn College softball and other official sporting events take place, as well as outside of rooms where Academic UIL events occur.
OTHER EVENTS OR PROGRAMS	Programs or divisions that wish to temporarily restrict concealed carry shall submit a written request for exemption in accordance with administrative regulations established by the District President/CEO.
PATIENT CARE AREAS	A license holder may carry a concealed handgun in health care fa- cilities located on a Blinn College campus.
FORMAL HEARING AREAS	A license holder shall be prohibited from carrying a concealed handgun during any grievance process, appeal proceeding involv- ing a disinterested third-party committee gathering testimony from the involved parties, or the formal hearing portion of the total pro- cess, as detailed in Board policy and administrative regulations. The hearing committee shall request that appropriate temporary signage regarding the ban be posted outside the location of such hearings, in accordance with law. Guidelines for posting approved signage shall be published in administrative regulations.
CAMPUS VEHICLES	A license holder may carry a concealed handgun in Blinn College vehicles.
OTHER WEAPONS PROHIBITED	The College District prohibits the use, possession, or display of any illegal knife, club, or prohibited weapon, as defined by law, on College District property or at a College District-sponsored or -related

activity, unless written authorization is granted in advance by the [head of college, initial upper case] or designee.

Additionally, the following weapons are prohibited on College District property or at any College District-sponsored or -related activity:

- 1. Fireworks of any kind;
- 2. Incendiary devices;
- 3. Instruments designed to expel a projectile with the use of pressurized air, like a BB gun;
- 4. Razors;
- 5. Chains; or
- 6. Martial arts throwing stars.

The possession or use of articles not generally considered to be weapons may be prohibited when the [head of college, initial upper case] or designee determines that a danger exists for any student, College District employee, or College District property by virtue of possession or use.

VIOLATIONS Employees and students found to be in violation of this policy shall be subject to disciplinary action. [See DH, FM, and FMA]
