Program Description: The Associate of Arts Degree in Theatre is intended to offer students the opportunity to take at Blinn College the first two years of a typical bachelor's degree in theatre at a four-year college or university. It also provides the flexibility for students desiring only an associate degree to specialize the program to individual interests.
