- Make sure every source cited in paper (including PRIMARY sources) is on your works-cited page
- Make sure works which are NOT cited in your paper are NOT on your works-cited page
- Include both primary and secondary sources
- Place article/poem/essay/short story titles in quotes and book/anthology/play titles in italics
