Third annual alumni awards announced

The Blinn College Ex-Students Association has selected five former students to receive its 2005 alumni awards.

The third annual awards will be presented during a ceremony on Oct. 22.

Steve Beard of New Ulm, Willie Mae Lueckemeyer of Brenham, A.M. McCaig

of Waller and Joe Al Picone of Brenham are recipients of the Outstanding Alumni Awards and the late Sam King Winkelmann of Brenham has been named Person of the Year.



Steve Beard

Beard, founder and chief executive officer of Beard Drilling Service Inc., attended Blinn from 1971 to 1972.

He was an all-American and two-time all-conference running back for the Buccaneer football team before transferring to Baylor University where he was named the 1974 Southwest Conference Offensive Player of the Year and an honorable mention all-American in 1974. He was also named the Texas Sports Writers Association Amateur Athlete of the Year and the Houston Post Southwest Conference Offensive Player of the Year and received the D.X. Bible Award.

He was drafted by the St. Louis Cardi-

nals of the NFL in 1975 and signed with the Winnipeg Blue Bombers of the Canadian Football League that year. He was selected to play in the CFL all star game in 1976.

Mr. Beard was inducted into the National Junior College Athletic Association Football Hall of Fame in 1996. He is a founding member of the Buccaneer Alumni Lettermen Association.

A native of Freeport, Texas, he graduated from Angleton High School. He and his wife, Meda, have three sons and a daughter-in-law: Steven and Sara, Mitch and Stewart.

Mr. Beard founded Beard Drilling Services in 1982. A foundation drilling contractor, the company specializes in drilled piers for commercial and industrial buildings and bridges and has offices in Austin, San Antonio and Waco.

Formerly of Teague, the Beards moved to The Falls near New Ulm in 2002.

Second annual alumni golf tournament scheduled for homecoming weekend

The Blinn College Ex-Students Association is hosting its second annual "fun raising" golf tournament for alumni and friends of Blinn College on Friday, Oct. 21, at Brenham County Club.

The salutatorian of her graduating class at Round Top-Carmine High School, she



was active at Blinn in the Future Business Leaders, on The Log student newspaper and in the chorus, the Bachelorettes, the Konza Club and the Lutheran Student Association.

She served on the student council and was a member of Phi Theta Kappa honor society.

Mrs. Lueckemeyer was employed as a legal secretary to W.J. Ehlert and later worked for Herbert Schroeder Accounting Firm for 14 years.

She was active in and a co-owner of the Odell Lueckemeyer Construction Co. founded in 1952, which later became Lueckemeyer Construction Inc. where she served as vice president and accountant until 2001.

Mrs. Lueckemeyer has served as treasurer of the Washington County Girl Scouts. She is an active member of St. Paul's Lutheran Church, having taught Sunday school and vacation Bible school.

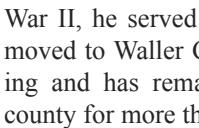
She has been active in the Brenham Maifest Association, is a lifetime member of the Heritage Society of Washington County, was on the board of the Blinn College Foundation, served as director for the Blinn College Ex-Students Association and is an emeritus member of the Blinn Foundation. She remains active in local affairs and in Blinn College activities.

She is married to Odell Lueckemeyer and they live in Brenham. They had two children. Their daughter Susan lives in Houston. Their son, John, is deceased.

A.M. McCaig

A.M. McCaig is the retired county judge for Waller County.

He was born and raised in Madison County and moved to the Gulf Coast in 1937 where he worked on Freeport jetties and in rice and peanut fields until joining the Civilian Conservation Corps. During World



War II, he served in the U.S. Army. He moved to Waller County and began farming and has remained a resident of the county for more than 60 years.

He retired after 10 years as county

judge. He also served eight years as a justice of the peace and eight years as a county commissioner.

Along with civil service, he was engaged in real estate investment and brokerage services for more than 30 years. He also engaged in retail sales.

Judge McCaig is a charter member of the Waller Lions Club and the Waller Volunteer Fire Department. He is active in the local chamber of commerce, Little League and other civic activities.

He served on the speaker's advisory committee for the Speaker of the Texas House of Representatives, as president of the Houston-Galveston Area Council, on the board of directors for the Texas Association of Counties and on the advisory board for Brenham State School.

He attended Blinn College in the 1950s on the G.I. Bill and completed his education at Prairie View A&M University.

He is active in Waller Baptist Church.

He and the former Nina Lou Wilson have been married for 64 years and have four children, 10 grandchildren and one great-grandchild.

Joe Al Picone

Jo Al Picone, currently the dean of financial services at Blinn College, is a native of Brenham and attended Blinn College in 1961.



He attended Baylor University and earned a bachelor of business administration degree in 1963. He is a 1969 graduate of the Texas Savings & Loan Executive School at the University of Texas.

After graduating from Baylor he worked as an accountant with Texaco Inc. in Houston from 1963-1965. He then joined South Central Savings Association of Brenham as executive vice president and served in that capacity until 1983 when the institution became First Savings Association of Brenham and he was named vice president and head of the loan department. In 1991 was named dean of financial services at Blinn where he is the chief budget officer and fiscal analyst.

Prior to his employment at Blinn, he spent 18 years as a member of the Blinn College Board of Trustees, having held the posts of board president and secretary.

Mr. Picone has been active in the community, most notably with 39 years of leadership and service in Lionism. He was se-

lected the head of Texas Lionism, serving as council chairman for Texas Multiple District 2. He has received the highest district award, international leadership awards, international presidential awards and was inducted in the Texas Lions Hall of Fame in 1997.

He has served in leadership roles in his community and church, was inducted into the Maifest Hall of Fame in 1985, was selected Washington County Man of the Year in 1997 and was inducted into the Phi Theta Kappa International Hall of Honor in 2000.

He currently serves as chairman of the City of Brenham Planning and Zoning Commission.

He and his wife, Merle, have been married for 41 years. They have two sons and a daughter-in-law -- Kyle, Kevin and Stacy -- and a granddaughter, Landry, age 4.

Sam King Winkelmann

The late Dr. Sam King Winkelmann, a Brenham native, graduated from Blinn College in 1970, received his undergraduate degree from Texas A&M University in 1972 and earned his doctorate of veterinary medicine in 1973.



While in high school, Mr. Winkelmann participated in rodeos, becoming a champion calf roper. In 2004, he was named to the Pendleton Roundup Hall of Honor in Pendleton, Ore.

After briefly working in private practice, he joined the Texas Animal Health Commission and later the U.S. Department of Agriculture. Mr. Winkelmann also ranched on his 100-plus-year-old family ranch in Washington County.

He was involved with the youth in the community through the Washington County Fair, the Go Texans Committee and the Houston Livestock Show and Rodeo Association. He retired as a vice president of the Houston organization and was the recipient of an honorary lifetime membership.

He and his family maintained a strong interest in education and particularly Blinn College. He was elected as a member of the Blinn College Board of Trustees in 1984 and served until 1990. His father Arnold "Sam" Winkelmann, served on the board from 1956 to 1972, including four years as board president.

He passed away in 2004 and included contributions to the college in his last will and testament.

Buccaneer Athletics

Hinze hired as new Buccaneer athletic director



Greg Hinze became the athletic director at Blinn College on July 15, coming from Sam Houston State University where he was assistant director of athletics for marketing and operations, a position he held since July 2003.

A native of Sealy, Hinze was the men's and women's head track and field coach at Sam Houston from 1998 until 2003.

From October 1993 until July 1998 he was the men's and women's head cross country coach and assistant track and field coach at

Texas A&M University. Prior to that he was assistant coach for

men's and women's track and field at Louisiana Tech University from 1992 to 1993 and at Stephen F. Austin State University from 1990 to 1992.

He was named the Southwest Conference Cross Country Coach of the Year in 1995, the Southland Conference Cross Country Coach of the Year in 2000 and the Southland Conference Outdoor Track Coach of the Year in 2003.

The graduate of Sealy High School, earned a bachelor of science degree in kinesiology from Texas A&M in 1990 and his master of education degree from Stephen F. Austin in 1992.

He and his wife, Diedre, have two daughters -- Reagan, 4, and Sydney, born June 24, 2005.

He replaces Kevin Steele, who resigned from the post after 10 months to take the athletic director's job at California Baptist University in Riverside.
