

Reasons you may need to appeal

1. Suspension GPA (cumulative 2.5 GPA)
2. Suspension Ratio (cumulative 75% completion rate)
3. Suspension Hours (over 96 credit hours)
4. Suspension Degree (have already received a degree)

**You may need to appeal for one or more combined to receive Financial Aid

How to tell if you have been approved or denied

1. **Appeal Sufficient**-- Appeal was approved for current semester.
2. **Appeal Insufficient**-- Appeal was denied for current semester.

How will I know if I am approved or denied Financial Aid?

1. Login to your myBlinn at www.my.blinn.edu
2. Click on My Records Tab
3. Financial Aid Awards
4. Select Aid Year
5. Click on Financial Aid Tab
6. Click on Financial Aid Status
7. Click on Academic Progress
8. It will pull up everything on your academic standing
(if you are making satisfactory progress you do not need to appeal)

Eligibility Requirements for 2012 - 2013 Aid Year

Status of Academic Progress is based on your academic performance for each term that you are enrolled. Progress towards the completion of your program of study is also a factor. Poor academic performance can affect eligibility for federal, state, and institutional financial assistance.

For example: This appeal was sufficient for the Spring 2013 semester.
