Blinn College District Executive Summary As of December 31, 2020

General

Tuition & Fees

Deferred tuition, fees, auxiliary fees, food service, housing, and parking revenue are recognized prorata over the term based on the number of months within the term.

State Appropriations

The FY 2021 State appropriations for formula funding and group insurance are recognized one-twelfth each month over the fiscal year, as revenues in the accompanying financial statements. Cash payments from the state are only received in 10 of the months each year, with no payments being received in January or February.

State appropriations specific to employee benefits are recognized each month as the cost is incurred.

Waivers & Exemptions

At 12/31/20, Waivers & Exemptions issued to students for FY 2021 totaled \$1.8 million versus \$2.2 million for FY 2020. The Hazelwood exemption comprises 40% of the total Waivers & Exemptions, followed by the Bryan Early Collegiate High School at 20%, Child Protective Services waiver at 14%, Technical Concurrent & Concurrent Enrolled at 9%, Dependent when Vet is Disabled at 5% and Other at 12%.

Net Increase (Decrease) in Operating Funds

The current year increase in operating funds of \$16.9 million is \$4.5 million higher than the prior year increase of \$12.4 million. This is primarily the result of the receipt of \$5.9 million in CARES Act Institutional revenue.

Cash Position & Transactions

Unrestricted Cash and Cash Equivalents were \$104.6 million and \$96.8 million at 12/31/20 and 12/31/19, respectively, representing an increase of \$7.8 million in cash.

Statement of Operating Revenues

State Appropriations

State Bill 2309 transferred the "powers and duties" of the Star of the Republic Museum to the Texas Historical Commission on 01/01/2020. As of this date forward, all state funding for the Museum is now appropriated to the Texas Historical Commission instead of the College.

Tuition and Fees

Current year net tuition and fees of \$32.6 million is \$0.7 million higher than the prior year of \$31.9 million, representing an increase of 2%. This increase is due to an increase in General Use Fee revenue of \$1.3 million, an increase in Lab and Course Fees of \$980 thousand, an increase in Workforce Fees of \$83 thousand and a decrease in Waivers and Exemptions of \$459 thousand. This increase is partially offset by a decrease in Out-of-District Tuition of \$1.4 million.

Auxiliary Enterprises

Current year auxiliary enterprises of \$4.7 million is \$3.3 million lower than prior year of \$8.1 million, representing a decrease of 42%. This decrease is a direct result of the measures taken to social distance on-campus housing, resulting in fewer students living on campus and fewer meal plans purchased.

Interest

Current year interest revenue has decreased \$664 thousand, or 74%, from the prior year. This decrease is primarily the result of decreased interest rates on our investments, as well as bond money that was previously invested is now expended on capital projects.

Miscellaneous Revenue

Current year Miscellaneous Revenue of \$6.1 million is \$5.8 million higher than prior year of \$297 thousand. This increase is primarily due to the receipt of \$5.9 million in CARES Act Institutional funds.

Statement of Expenditures by Function

General Academic & Vocational Programs

General Academic and Vocational Programs expenditures were \$16.0 million and \$16.5 million at 12/31/20 and 12/31/19, respectively, representing a decrease of 3%. The decrease is primarily due to the decrease in enrollment resulting in a decrease in the cost in Instruction.

Academic Support

Academic Support expenditures were \$3.2 and \$3.4 million at 12/31/20 and 12/31/19, respectively, representing a decrease of 6%. This temporary decrease is primarily due to the timing of academic software license payments.

Operation and Maintenance of Plant

The overall change to Operation and Maintenance of Plant is a net increase of \$81 thousand over prior fiscal year. This net increase is due primarily to an increase in Plant Support of \$104 thousand and an increase in Custodial Services of \$123 thousand. The increase in Custodial Services is due to timing of invoice payments and the increase in Plant Support is primarily due to the timing of insurance payments and an increase in cost of building rentals. The increases are offset by a decrease in Campus Security of \$108 thousand. Campus Security decrease is primarily due to cost savings from contract labor and equipment purchases.

Housing

Housing expenditures were \$724 thousand and \$838 thousand expenditures at 12/31/20 and 12/31/19, respectively, representing a decrease of 14%. This decrease is primarily due to the reduction in the number of students served due to COVID 19

Food Services

Food Services expenditures were \$866 thousand and \$1.2 million at 12/31/20 and 12/31/19, respectively, representing a decrease of 26%. This decrease is primarily due to the reduction in the number of students served due to COVID-19.

Athletics

Athletic expenditures were \$754 thousand and \$985 thousand at 12/31/20 and 12/31/19 respectively, representing a decrease of 23%. This decrease is directly related to fall athletic activities postponed until spring due to COVID-19.

Student Activities

Student Activity expenditures were \$75 thousand and \$182 thousand at 12/31/20 and 12/31/19 respectively, representing a decrease of 59%. This decrease is directly related to the College's response to social distancing.

Statement of Expenditures by Category

Travel

Travel decreased by \$449 thousand, or 71%, primarily due to COVID-19 travel cancellations and restrictions on all travel related activities.

Services

Services decreased by \$165 thousand, or 5%. The decrease is primarily due to the timing of software payments.

Consumables

Consumables decreased by \$835 thousand, or 51%. The decrease is primarily due to the decreased number of employees on campuses in order to achieve social distancing.

Miscellaneous

Miscellaneous expense decreased by \$146 thousand, or 41%. The decrease is primarily due to no athletic events in Fall 2020 and a decrease in Banking Service Fees.

Facility Rental

Facility Rental increased by \$80 thousand, or 20%,. This increase is primarily due to a \$73 thousand increase of facility rental with TAMU.

Furniture, Equipment, and Property

Furniture, Equipment, and Property decreased by \$60 thousand, or 100%. This decrease is primarily due to decrease number of employees on campus in order to achieve social distancing.

Statement of Net Position

Assets

Construction Funds

The College received \$30 million in 2019 bond proceeds for the construction of the Brenham Science, Technology, Engineering, and Innovation Building. Approximately \$10 million has been spent to-date on this new building. The College received \$18 million in 2020 bond proceeds in October 2020.

Capital Assets

Net Capital Assets are valued at \$169.6 million, an increase of \$15 million.

Deferred Outflows

Deferred Outflows increased \$3.6 million and decreased \$1.7 million from prior year due to adjustments in GASB 75 related to Other Post Employment Benefits and GASB 68 related to pensions, respectively.

Liabilities

Deferred Revenue

At 12/31/2020 Deferred Revenue is comprised of Spring 2021:

Spring 2021 deferred revenue is \$20 million of tuition and fees and \$3.1 thousand of Auxiliary Housing and Food Service as compared to \$21.8 million of tuition and fees and \$5 million of Auxiliary Housing and Food Service for the prior year. The Spring 2021 Housing assignments will be reduced to achieve social distancing.

Bonds Payable

Bonds payable have increased by \$14.3 million due to the new 2020 bond issuance less the refunding of 2010 bond series and bond debt payments.

Net Pension Liability

Net Pension Liability increased by \$9.7 million and decreased by \$1.1 million from prior year due to the actuary calculated liability adjustments to GASB 75 related to Other Post Employment Benefits and GASB 68 related to pensions, respectively.

Deferred Inflows

Deferred Inflows decreased by \$6.3 million and increased by \$1.4 million from prior year due to adjustments in GASB 75 related to Other Post Employment Benefits and GASB 68 related to pensions, respectively.

Net Assets

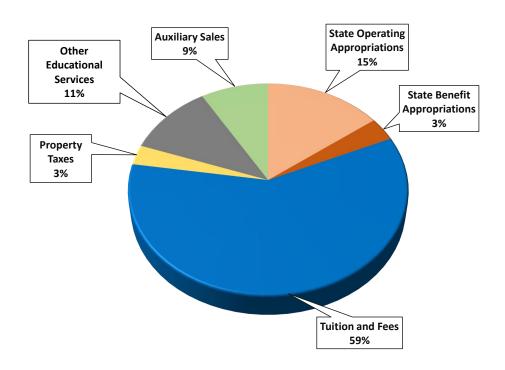
Unrestricted net assets increased by \$6.5 million from prior year.

Senate Bill 2309 transferred the "powers and duties" of the Star of the Republic Museum to the Texas Historical Commission on 01/01/2020. The Museum's deficit fund balance of \$635,896 was absorbed into the College's Unrestricted fund balance as of 12/31/2019. The Assets of the Museum remain in the College's Capital Assets.

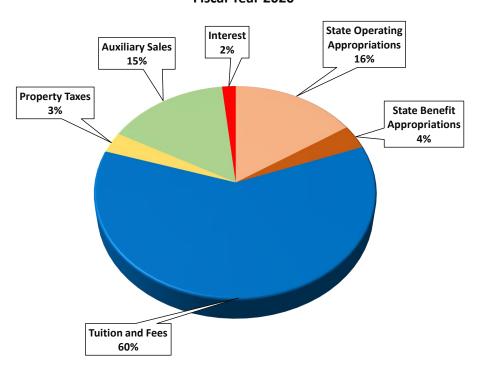

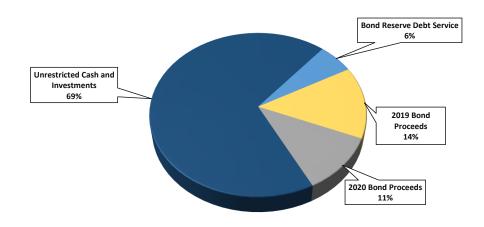

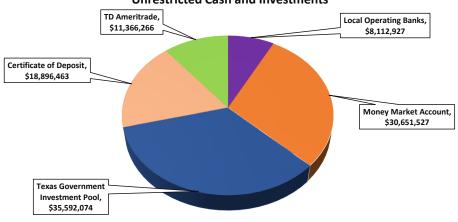

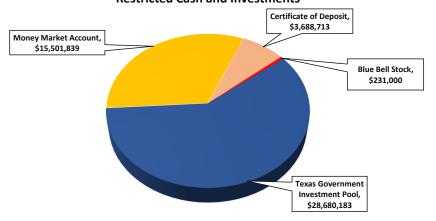
Allocation of Total Cash and Investments
