Students utilizing this policy will still need to meet all pre-requisite or state specific content requirements as outlined in the Academic Progression and General Education Requirements policy sections for their chosen program to reach this applied credit total.

\*\*In order to reach the maximum number of 72 LD credits in transfer for the BSCJA/M v4 program at UOPX a student may need to complete more credits outside of the prescribed amount for the Associate of Arts Degree with Field of Study Transfer Curriculum in Criminal Justice and petition for course waivers using transfer courses of equivalent content to the Required Course of Study degree requirements at UOPX.
